

# WEEDONS SCHOOL BOARD OF TRUSTEES

## ENROLMENT SCHEME

As it is empowered by the Education Act 1989, The Weedons School Board of Trustees has adopted the following scheme governing enrolments at Weedons School on the basis that there is likely to be overcrowding and to avoid such overcrowding.

### ENROLMENTS:

#### Home Zone

The Weedons School Zone has been identified to accommodate the students who have Weedons School as their closest school and other traditional Weedons School areas that have served several generations.

All students who live in the home zone below are entitled to enrol at Weedons School at any time. Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

**Addresses on both side of boundary roads will be considered in-zone unless otherwise stated below.**

Applicants are entitled to enrol at Weedons School if their usual place of residence is within the zone which has the following boundaries:

- West along Newtons Road to Knights Road
- South west on Knights Road to Hoskyns Road
- North west on Hoskyns Road to West Melton Road
- South west on West Melton Road to Railway Road/ Kerrs Road intersection
- South west on Kerrs Road to Wards Road
- South east on Wards Road to Jones Road
- East on Jones Road to George Holmes Road
- South on George Holmes Road to Main South Road
- East on Main south road to Weedons Road
- South on Weedons Road to Levi Road
- From Weedons Road / Levi Road intersection, along Levi Road to 72 Levi Road
- From the Weedons Road / Levi Road intersection, along Weedons Road to 503 Weedons Road (including Glenbogle Drive)
- Back north along Weedons Road to the Main South Road
- East on Main South Road to Larcombs Road
- South east on Larcombs Road to Bellam Road (including all addresses on Paige Place)

- North on Bellam Road to Robinsons Road
- North on Robinsons Road to Main South Road / Curraghs Road
- North on Curraghs Road to Newtons Road

Those living on the boundary roads or have any piece of farm land on the boundary or within the zone are also entitled to enrol.

A map showing the home zone is available from our school office and can also be found on our website.

### **OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS:**

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

<b><u>First Priority</u></b>	This priority category is not available at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
<b><u>Second Priority</u></b>	Must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
<b><u>Third Priority</u></b>	Must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
<b><u>Fourth Priority</u></b>	Must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former pupil of the school.
<b><u>Fifth Priority</u></b>	Must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
<b><u>Sixth Priority</u></b>	Must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area of the school.
